OUANGO = Ouasi-Autonomous Non-Governmental Organization, or an NGO that includes governmental elements. In short, a collaboration between the private sector and government to create yet more bureaucracy. Often an excuse to have everyone fly out to exotic destinations to spend taxpayer money at fancy conferences.
